**SPEAKERS REVIEW by Cathy Palmquist**

**Carol Hanson** reintroduced **Gabriel Bay** our exchange student from Argentina, who is ending his U.S. visit. Gabriel started off saying he was not too prepared, but most Rotarians thought that was just as well, as he told of his experience with us.

He is from Argentina, which is in South America, where Spanish is spoken. He lives in Buenos Aires, the capital and economic center of the country. While it is a city of 100,000 residents, and is industrialized, exporting Ferraris and Volkswagens, it is a rural country, a city surrounded by farms. It was founded by a German and built by Italians. "We have cowboys in the rural areas that are called *gauchos*." Pato is Argentina's national sport, a game played on horseback with a ball and net. He showed a photo of his large family, noting that his father is not in the picture because his parents are divorced.

He said the country is "a flat place, with no mountains – pretty boring. Going to another country helps you appreciate your own country," he said, noting they do have waterfalls and lots of penguins.

Gabriel likes surfing and being outside more than anything else. One of his best days here was when he went to Blue Mountain to ski. He has never skied and took no lessons, so he kept falling over and over. He finally got the hang of it, and said it was awesome and he was pretty impressed with himself. He is glad to be in West Chester, though listening to the Rotary program last week, he learned it was not always as nice as it is now. "West Chester has its own unique essence," he said, "like your own fairy tale."

"As an exchange student you don't know the language or anything, and feel like a lost bird. There's

a lot to learn. It's been pretty nice, getting to live with other people," he said, with special thanks to his two host families. "Every family is different. It teaches us about people and the world.

"My thanks to Ernesto (Ernest Zlotlow) for taking me to Shriners' Hospital to welcome children who lost extremities. I learned a lot about life. It was one of the best experiences ever. Although the children lost extremities, we speak the same language (Spanish), so we clicked right away (with the Nicaraguan boys). Now I realize how important Rotary is – you help people who most need help. Rotary is important in the whole world. Because of Rotary, the world is better. I see it with my own eyes and I want to become one of you.

"When you come to a new country you learn about your own life, as well as new places. It's been pretty good to come here. It made me a better person. I will go back home and get involved in Rotary, and get others into Rotary Even when I go home, I will never be completely home again – half of my home will be here. I hope we can all make the whole world better."

"You **are** part of our Rotary family," said **President Bob Rogers**.

What a thoughtful exchange student, who touched many lives and hearts while he was here. And what a great ambassador for Rotary! Our best wishes go with you, Gabriel.
