SPEAKER'S REVIEW by Glen Sweet

Illiama (Alaska) Float Plane Crash

Bob Frame introduced Dave Wood who survived a float plane crash in a remote area of Alaska. Dave began his talk by describing his best friend and fellow outdoorsman, James Specter who did not survive the crash. Dave and Dr. Specter, an oral surgeon, were vacationing at the luxury Rainbow King Fishing Lodge. Weather permitting there was a daily flight with guides from the Lodge to a remote fishing spot.

In the pre-dawn of September 15, 2015, **Dave** and Dr. Specter along with other passengers boarded a Dehavilland Otter 11 passenger float plane. Dave sat behind the pilot on the left side of the place. His friend, Dr. Specter, was an experienced pilot and asked the pilot if he could sit in the co-pilot's seat for the flight.

The plane took off and reached an altitude of only 10 to 15 feet when **Dave** felt the plane hit ground. The right side of the plane, where his friend sat, was crushed on impact. Dr. Specter suffered many internal injuries and broken bones and likely died within one to two minutes after impact. All three passengers in the front of the plane on the right side were killed.

The young fishing guides helped **Dave** get out of the plane. He had several broken ribs, a broken ankle and collapsed lungs. Natives carried him on a back board to the local "clinic" which had little in the way of medical equipment. Then the Air National Guard came and flew him to the Alaska Native Medical Center in Anchorage which was a Level 2 Trauma Center. **Dave** could not fly home because his lungs were not clear. His wife came and they flew a nurse from Jefferson Hospital to Anchorage. Eventually, when he was able to fly, the nurse flew with them and he went to Jefferson Hospital to recuperate. He was on a morphine drip and then oxycodone for six weeks.

The plane was overweight and tail heavy and those are believed to be the causes of the crash. **Dave** said the experience makes him treat every day as a gift. "That's why they call it the present."
