# ROTARY INTERNATIONAL- Mission of Peace By Charles Streitwieser

Why is PEACE a central part of Rotary International's mission? How do we know what peace is? How do we attain it? How do we keep it alive when forces of division, political opposition and religious hatred are

its arch enemies? Because since its founding, peace is Rotary's DNA.

Consider some of Rotary history as our guide:

- About half of the founders of the United Nations were Rotarians. (True, the League of Nations preceded the UN but it was never as international.) World Peace was, and still is, its core mission.
- Only Rotary can easily cross forbidden lines in Pakistan/India, Palestine/Israel, Russia/Ukraine and USA/Iran where Rotarians help communities no matter what the barrier.
- The Rotary Centers for Peace and Conflict Resolution are graduate programs whose graduates go on to work in the toughest places and link to each other globally via their own special intranet. <a href="https://my.rotary.org/en/document/rotary-peace-centers-making-peace-reality">https://my.rotary.org/en/document/rotary-peace-centers-making-peace-reality</a>
- In the early in 1900's, the founder of Rotary, Paul Harris, was a personal friend Lord Robert Baden-Powell, the founder of the (international) Boy Scouts movement. They travelled together frequently by train and boat christening local outposts of their vision along the way in London, Chicago, Philadelphia and Seattle.

Peace is the glue of Rotary, you might say. Fellowship is its foundation along with an unwavering commitment to improving communities - no matter where they are on the globe. As members of Rotary International, we are truly members of a global community (35,000+ Rotary Clubs in over 148 countries). We use this network of Rotarians to reach out and help others wherever we are inspired. We are in more countries than any other international organization and we are the largest civil service organization in the world.

Rotarians do not endorse any political side or any religious point of view. All are welcome. Each year Rotary International has an international convention – and it is wonder of peaceful interaction, learning and sharing of cultures and ideals for a better world. There is no sense of "tenure" in the Rotary world. Personally, I have never felt so at ease in any country than at these conventions. Everyone looks out for everyone else and seeks to find new ideas to bring back to their clubs. That is a wonderful hallmark of what Peace has to offer.
