There are only 500 Youth philanthropy organizations in our country.

In 2022 Sow Good Now:

500 children from diverse areas were engaged in 1:1 mentoring about charity in their lives.

435 Athletes volunteered and shared their talents and gifts.

480 items were collected and distributed to area youth.

1800 athletes engaged. Some of the youth then go on to play sports at the college level.

Teen anxiety and depression is growing and teen volunteerism is decreasing. Mary stressed that we should have a moral obligation to help our youth.
